## Junior Instructor Update: Through the Ice

Junior instructors spend the year volunteering with all of our ELC programs. From sea kayaking the Mississippi for a week to snowshoeing with the young explorers for a few hours, they are our second set of eyes, ears, and enthusiasm. Outside of programs, the JI's have group events and trips, from first aid training to floodwater paddling in the spring. This season has been filled with unique adventures that most adults have never even considered.

**Ice Rescue Drill**: Out of respect for the variables of winter travel, we practice ice rescues with the junior instructors. It provides an opportunity to go through the ice in a controlled environment with dry clothes, a heated tent, and hot chocolate ready to go. The students can stash this valuable experience into their backpacks while hiking around the icy Cannon Bottoms or a snow-covered lake in the BWCA.

**Sled Dog Race:** The John Beargrease Sled Dog Marathon was held on the North Shore and a group of eight ELC boys volunteered. They spent the weekend exploring the Kadunce and the Encampment rivers, skiing at Pincushion, hanging out at the cabin, and playing hockey. In Two Harbors, they helped with the Beargrease Marathon by holding the dog teams at the beginning of the race.

**Ice Climbing:** Before the snow melts, the group will strap on crampons, grab a couple ice tools, and tie into a climbing rope to ascend the backyard ice wall in Red Wing.


