CORE PROGRAMS

PIONEERING I – HAY CREEK CABIN

Minimum Age: 6th grade

Fee: 55.00

Prerequisite: Explore and Camping

Along the way we will practice outdoor cookery, securing safe water, proper clothing selection, wildlife observation, navigation with map and compass, and low impact camping.

This trip will offer many scenic vistas, steep and rugged hiking along the shores of Lake Superior. While on the course we will practice low impact camping techniques, develop an understanding of the local flora and fauna, and increase wilderness travel and camping skills.
